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Mobilized women to make marks for more than 20,000 vulnerable groups, which brought employment opportunities, women empowerment, and safety protection








- Strengthen community network building and engagement

- Mobilize newcomers groups and volunteers to develop multicultural activities




2021-22 FINANCIALS
